FROM TOM'S DESK

One of the things I like about the bible study we have been doing is that we are asked to think about the people with whom we can share what we learned. I want to talk about this with you for a moment. For all my life, I have watched Christians coming faithfully to church, going about committee work, participating in the activities of the church, and putting their dollars in the plate. Often, I hear complaints that, after all of that, the church continues to decline. I want to address that today.

One of the things I hope to help you with this year, is learning a language to share your faith. There are two reasons for this. First, each of us has contact with people in the community that the rest of us never get to meet. As the book <u>Unbinding the Gospel</u> puts it, "People see **you**, not your pastor, as the person with the "real" faith life. You have credibility. You are the one with friends in the neighborhood. You are the one with a job in town, friends in classes. And no one sees you as the hired gun, paid to talk about God. Think of the people in your life who have no one to pray for them. People you know, people you run into every day need different types of help. Many have no church to turn to. Could you start by praying for them?"

Secondly, I want you to be able to talk about your faith for yourself. One of my mentors told me that I would never really know what I believed until I had to preach it. By the same token, you won't know what you truly believe about God until you try to explain it to someone else. Your explanation doesn't have to be perfect, and it doesn't have to lead someone else to a decision. It just has to be sincere. We'll talk more about this as the year progresses. *Tom*
